## Ryder Klaassen Wins Big at 2021 Junior Wheat Show with Doublestop CL Plus

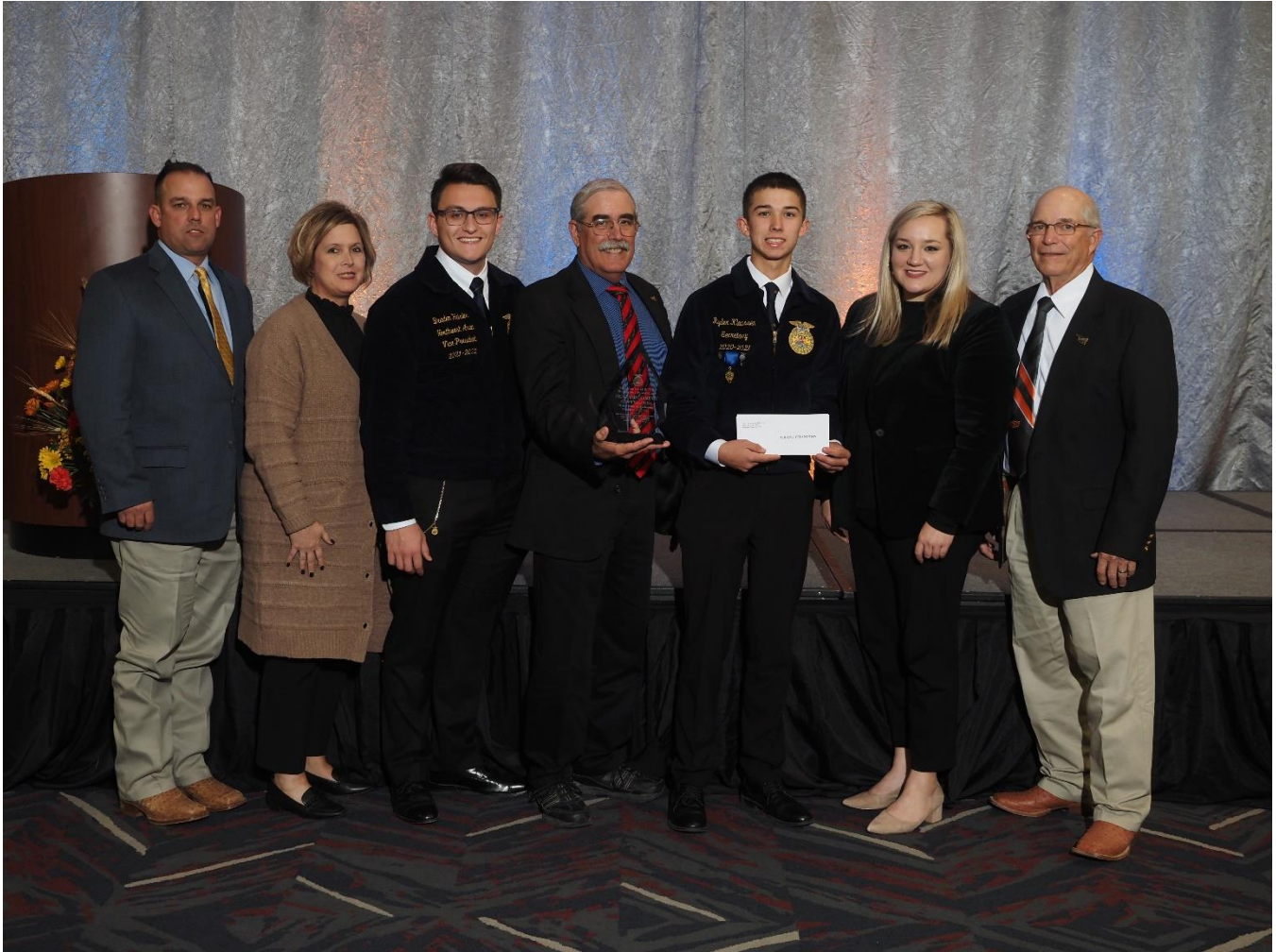
Oklahoma City, OK – Ryder Klaassen, son of Chris and Ginger Klaassen, was awarded the overall grand champion award showing his Doublestop CL Plus variety in the 2021 Oklahoma 4-H/FFA Junior Wheat Show. Klaassen placed 1st in production and milling and 2<sup>nd</sup> in baking, earning him the title of 1<sup>st</sup> place as the FFA champion, and overall grand champion of the 4-H and FFA Junior Wheat Show. Ryder also placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall in the FFA competition with his Smith's Gold variety along with placing 2<sup>nd</sup> in the production and milling competition.

According to Kim Anderson, Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service grain marketing specialist; "Participating students learn what it takes to produce milling quality wheat." He also stated that "The purpose of this program is to promote the production of quality wheat and teach 4-H and FFA youth about wheat production, marketing, and management."

Klaassen, a member of the Hydro-Eakly FFA in Caddo County, received a \$1000 premium from Oklahoma Genetics Inc (OGI) for winning 1<sup>st</sup> place and then Grand Champion overall in the FFA competition with the Doublestop CL Plus variety and an additional \$400 from OGI for placing 2<sup>nd</sup> with his Smith's Gold variety. Klaassen also received a \$500 premium for being FFA champion and grand champion from WestBred® and received a \$400 combined premium for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place from the Oklahoma Wheat Research Foundation, along with a \$75.00 premium for production, milling, bake contest and trophies. Klaassen would have normally won a \$3000 scholarship but with his previous winnings, he has now maxed out his scholarship potential during his 4-H and FFA career.

In all, \$16,000 in scholarship money was given away at the banquet. Scholarships are funded by Check-off dollars and awarded to the top five 4-H and top five FFA entries. 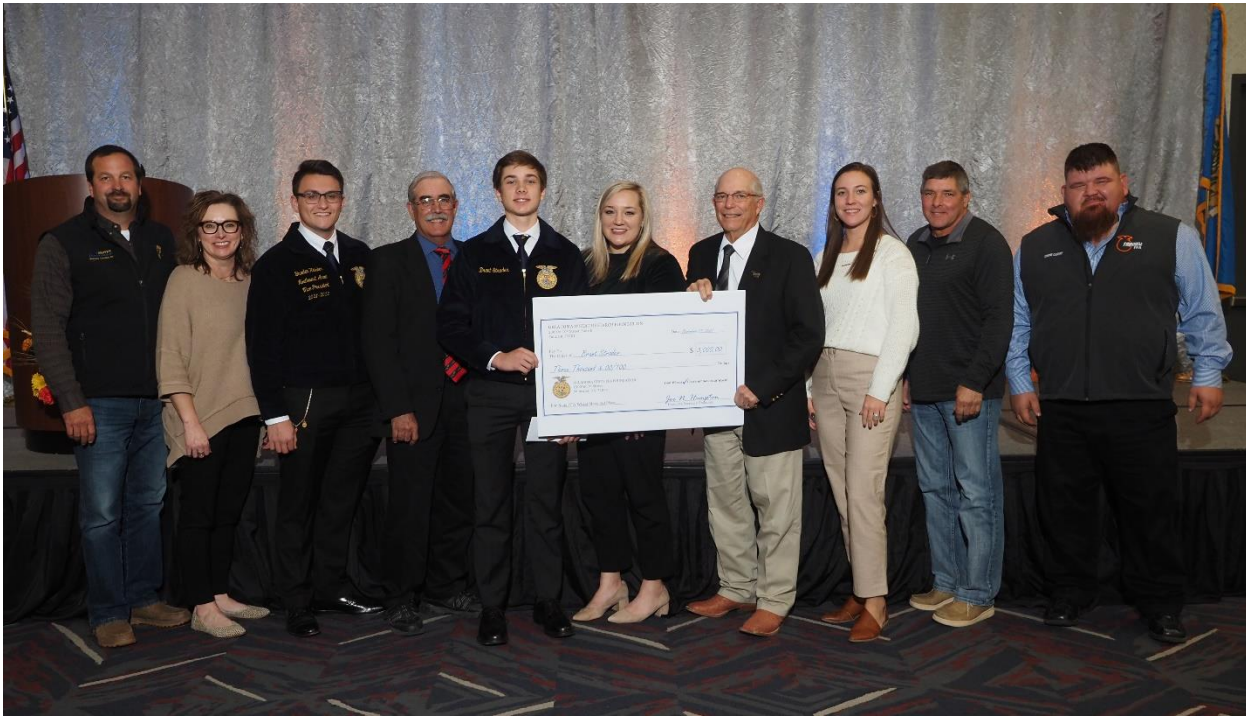
## Brant Strader wins 3<sup>rd</sup> place at the 2021 4-H/FFA Junior Wheat Show

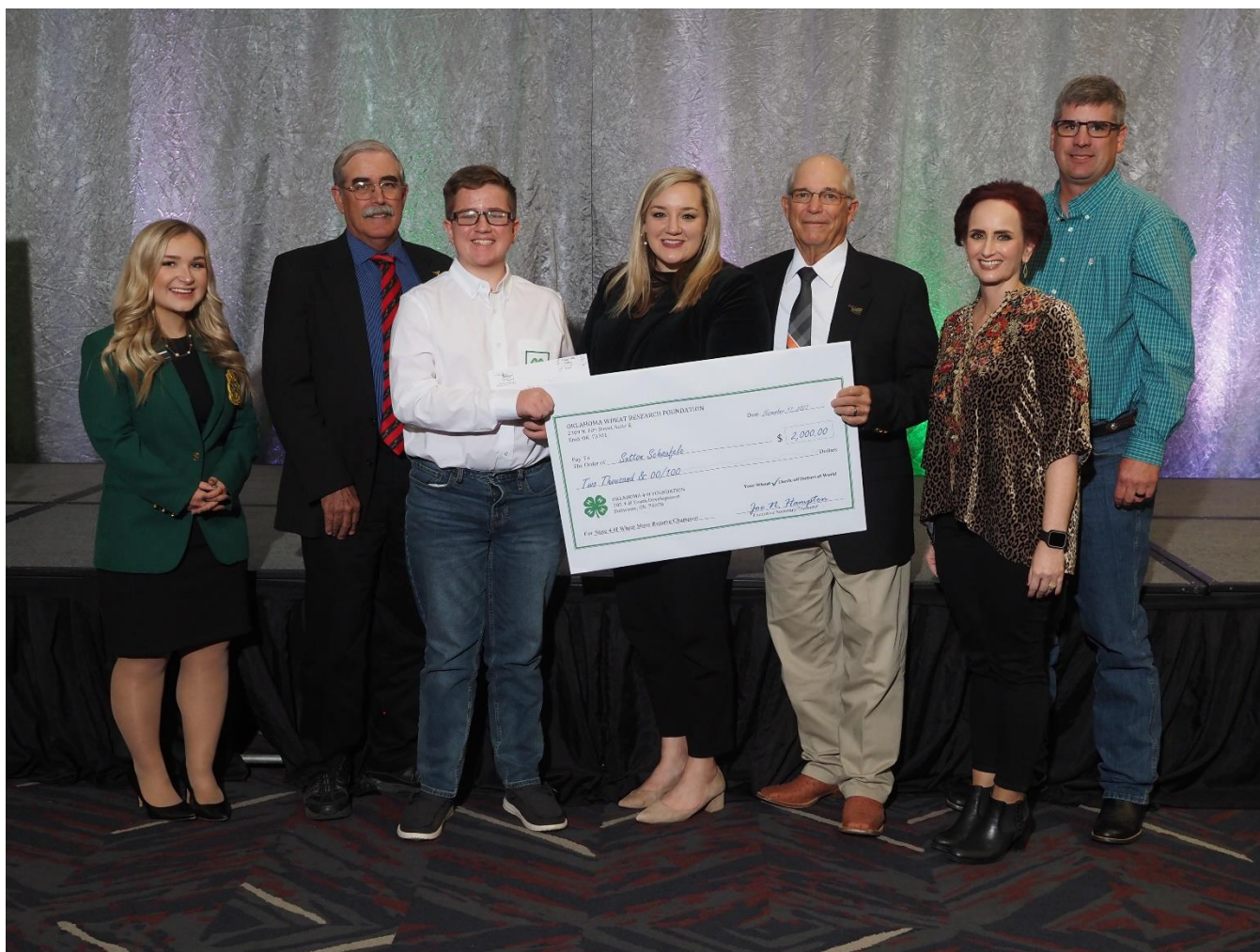
## Sutton Schaufele wins 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the 2021 4-H/FFA Junior Wheat Show
