Swaim placed 9<sup>th</sup> in production and milling and 1<sup>st</sup> in baking, (for which he receives a plaque) earning him top awards. Swaim is a member of the Okeene FFA chapter. an additional \$50 premium from Oklahoma Wheat Research Foundation,
