"Just four multinational corporations own over one-half of the world's seed supply for all crops, and for major field crops like corn and soybean. that percentage is strikingly closer to 100. In contrast, Oklahoma State University owns the intellectual property rights to about 70% of the seed currently in the Oklahoma wheat ground. That is a dichotomy that cannot go ignored...because it is not guaranteed. Oklahoma seed producers have access to seed genetics - and therefore a claim to authenticity – that is simply rare. It is my opinion we, at OSU, should vigorously protect that access. Our longevity in real-world crop improvement hinges on the seed producers' success - and, in a larger sense, the road to food stability starts with the seed in the ground."



DR. BRETT CARVER

Regents Professor & Wheat Genetics Ag Chair OSU

Winner of the 2022 OSU Eminent Faculty Award, Dr. Carver has published nearly 200 scholarly works and released 37 wheat varieties - including the Top 4 varieties planted in Oklahoma since 2015.
